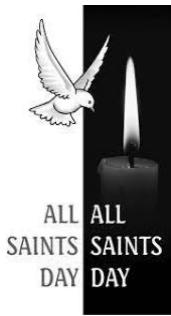

with Bishop Lanette

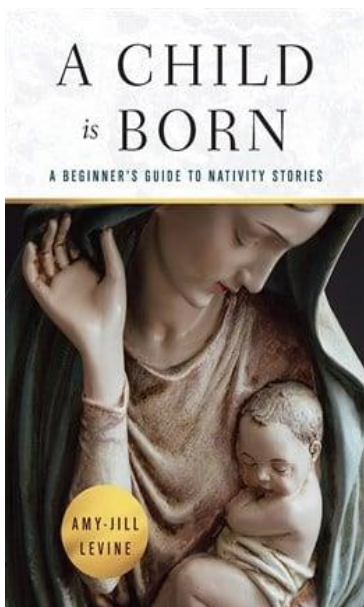
Weekly discussions will be held via Zoom on Monday evenings,

The study delves into the narratives of Isaac and Ishmael, Moses, and Samuel to reveal how they foreshadow and enrich the timeless Christmas story in the final chapter.

Author Amy-Jill Levine brings her expert knowledge of Scripture and careful consideration of the Christian story to show readers how Scripture's earlier birth stories anticipate the story of Jesus's birth and how the birth resonates and gives new meaning to those earlier stories.

For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.”- **Psalms 100**

“Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.”- **1 Thessalonians 5:16-18**

“Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful.”- **Colossians 4:2**

“Praise the Lord. Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever. Who can proclaim the mighty acts of the Lord or fully declare his praise?”- **Psalms 106:1-2**
