Opening Meditation

Today as we dive into the book of James, we will notice that he doesn't like all this hanging around waiting for stuff to happen. He wants to get to work. James is a doer, a worker. And he says if we are going to fill ourselves up with something, if we are going to occupy ourselves with something, it might as well be the right things. There are the heavy things, says James, the things that weigh you down, the things that are never satisfying, never enough, the things that always make you want more, that measure your worth not by what you have but by what you don't have, or by what someone else has.

Or, James says, praise be to God, we can make peace; we can sow peace.
